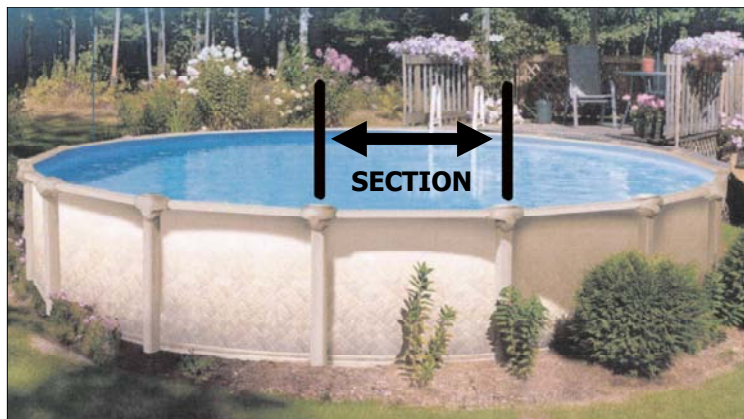


TWO EASY STEPS TO ORDERING RESIN POOL FENCING

STEP 1

Determine how much of your pool you want to fence. Fence is calculated by “sections” - the amount of fence used to cover a top rail on your pool, from pool support post to pool support post. Count the pool top rails you want to cover with fence - use this number for the next step.



STEP 2

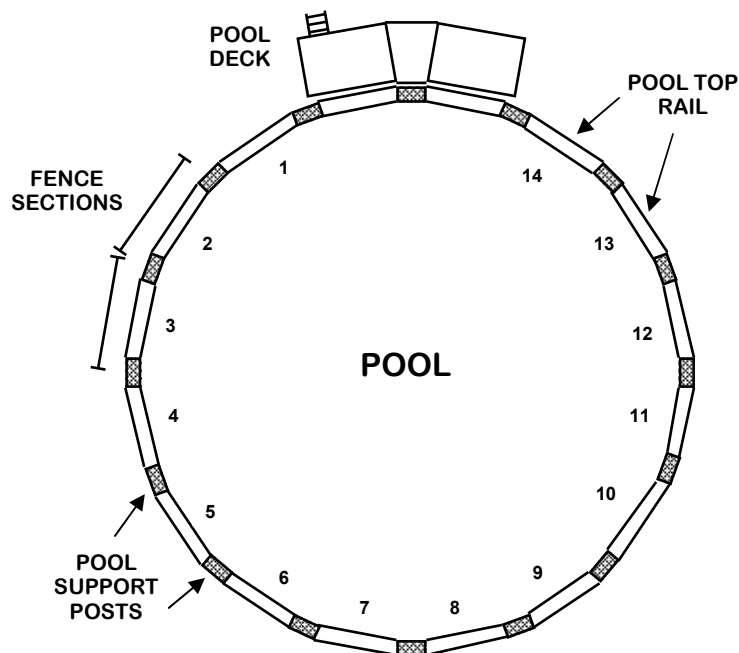
Choose the appropriate fence pack kits required. From Step 1, use the number of fence sections desired & refer to our “Breakdown Charts” to determine the fence pack kits required to order. Note: all fence pack kits include all hardware & instructions required for installation. (Packaging allows for 8 sections minimum)

BREAKDOWN CHARTS

EXAMPLE

This example illustrates a typical round pool with 16 pool top rails. The pool has a deck taking up two top rails of the pool, therefore, 14 sections of fence are required to completely enclose & protect the remainder of the pool. From the charts above, 14 sections = 1 A & 2 B fence pack kits - order appropriately.
